Residents will receive notice when their section of boxes is being scheduled for replacement and what to bring to the Office to obtain your new key.

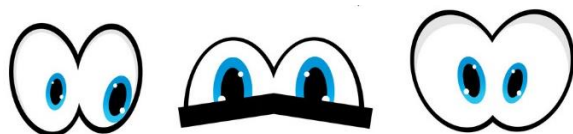
